I would like to take this opportunity to ask parents to be aware of the ways in which their children are using social media. One of the most beneficial ways to support your children is to model when you are using social media, by being respectful and considerate to the fact that posts on social media are often one person's point of view, shared when they are in an emotive state. Encourage your children to talk to you. Make them aware that once a post is posted it is shared with more than their friends as it often goes to friends of friends who have no knowledge of the situation. Children may be under the impression that posts can be removed and unaware that screen shots can be taken and posts can be retrieved. Often people can regret what they have posted but the damage is done. This then causes additional upset or bias to those who sent the post and those who received it.

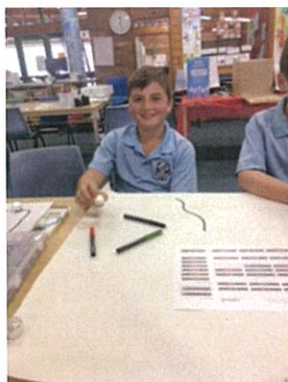
Cross Country
